CANNONAU DI SARDEGNA RISERVA:

100% Cannonau, better known throughout the world as Grenache.

MARCHESE DI VILLAMARINA:

TANCA FARRA:

A unique blend of 50% Cabernet Sauvignon and 50% Cannonau. 2004 Vintage: 91 Points – *Wine Enthusiast*, July 2009

TERRE BIANCHE TORBATO:

Fresh, crisp and flavorful white wine – made from 100% Torbato (the only Torbato imported into the U.S. market)

TERRE RARE RISERVA:

A warm, sunny climate red wine produced from 100% Carignan in the Sulcis region of SW Sardinia. "World's Best Wine Values under \$25" – *Robert Parker*, 2010

THILION:

50% Torbato, 50% Sauvignon Blanc. An opulent and intense wine indicative of mature grapes.

In Italy and elsewhere in Europe, wine connoisseurs and the industry professionals rate Sella & Mosca among Italy's most outstanding wine estates. Sella & Mosca's I Piani estate in Sardinia constitutes the second largest contiguous vineyard in Italy and counts itself among the country's most impressive wineries. Situated in the northwest corner of Sardinia, just inland from the beautiful, historic port of Alghero, this 1,600-acre property with more than 1,200 acres of vines is one of the largest wine estates in Europe.

Sella & Mosca, which celebrated its centennial in 1999, was founded by Messrs. Sella & Mosca, two Piedmontese businessmen respected to this day for their prominent roles in the Risorgimento (Italy's 19th-century unification movement). Today, the property is owned by Campari.

As Sardinia's foremost wine producer, Sella & Mosca is renowned for premium wines made exclusively from estate-grown grapes. In addition to native varieties such as Vermentino, Torbato, and Cannonau, the winery has successfully pioneered the introduction of international grape varieties, notably Cabernet Sauvignon.

Surrounded by landscaped gardens and a profusion of flowering oleanders, the estate winery features multiple tasting rooms, an expertly designed enoteca and a fascinating exhibit showcasing the replicas of archaeological finds unearthed on the estate and that are now housed in museums. Each year, especially during the summer months, the estate attracts visitors from all over Europe, who come to see this spectacular property for themselves. The news of its intriguing wines has also started to resonate with American lovers of fine Italian wines.
